
Yuck Circus

It is not the loudest show on the Fringe, nor the most energetic. But it is welcoming, assured, not trying too hard because it doesn't have to. This is comedy in cruise control.

Barbaren Barbies Underbelly, George Square 16.00



Kevin Quantum Gilded Balloon - Patter Hoose 14.30





The show will be at Assembly George Square, The Crate from 31st July - 25th August. Tickets are on sale now.

Mum and I Don't Talk Anymore is the eagerly awaited writing debut from actress Milanka Brooks - a show about her relationship with her Serbian mother...and perhaps most importantly, an introduction to Slivovitz. But at the heart of it is two women who'd discuss everything from perfecting their exercise routine, to libertine lovers, to scissoring. But the big question is, why do Milanka and her Mum not talk anymore?

This is an extremely funny, candid and poignant debut solo show about the unique and crazy relationship between Milanka and her flamboyant mother, Lela. A touching story of a female double act who together hustled their way through life's challenges. Through a series of incredible characters introduced throughout, audiences truly get to know Lela and are invited on a journey that will leave you feeling inspired and ready to take on the world, "Dat is inevitable". as she would sav.

On making her Edinburgh debut Milanka said: "I'm so thrilled to be bringing my first solo show to this year's Fringe Festival. When Milanka is not writing, she can be seen as Elena Tulaska in the Emmy award-winning episode of Black Mirror; USS Callister on Netflix, and she is currently filming a high profile and confidential show for one of the major streamers. As an actor and writer her credits include the multi-award winning BBC1 sitcom, My Family and she is best known for playing lonela in ITV's Benidorm, and Princess Svetlana in Netflix's The Windsors.






