A Fringe debut that's weird, witty, and way too relatable.

Edinburgh, meet Bea P. Deigh—your new favourite corporate overlord of the human mind. Equal parts absurdist comedy and emotional excavation, this sharply original debut heads to The Space Triplex from 11—24 August, promising a surreal ride through inner monologue, office politics, and mental health... all wrapped in one gloriously off-kilter solo show.

Bea, our charmingly unhinged narrator (played and written by Arden Winant), is the self-proclaimed Head Secretary at The Brain, Inc., an imaginary workplace inside the mind of an unnamed client. It's her first day, and she's got a lot to prove. The setup is bizarre, but behind the corporate lingo and office antics is something heartfelt, familiar, and quietly raw: the tangled mess of managing mental health, identity, and the absurd expectations of "functioning" in a world that often doesn't make sense.

Directed by Grainne Robson, the show straddles absurdist comedy and mental health theatre with poise and pace. Robson says it best: "Putting mental health on stage is difficult but important. Everyone has a different interpretation to a feeling, an experience, a diagnosis. This show is about honouring Arden's story while also taking care of the audience." Expect

moments of fast-talking comedy, unexpected tenderness, and the occasional existential side-eye.

The show arrives in Edinburgh off the back of glowing reviews:



It also comes with a seal of Fringe cred: Bea P. Deigh is a recipient of the Keep It Fringe Fund, supported by Phoebe Waller-Bridge and Fringe Society. Producer Hannah Jayne says the funding "meant we could actually afford a venue, not a life-size Gonzo puppet, unfortunately." Priorities.

With a single preview at London's The Glitch before its full Fringe run, this is one of those word-of-mouth gems in the making. Smart, strange, sincere and just the right amount of chaotic.





MAKING THE MOST OF THE FESTIVAL

Here are some tips from comedians for how best to ensure you have a brilliant time whilst enioving the Edinburgh Fringe.

"Sabzi on Ferry Road is a phenomenal family run restaurant (I recommend the apple pie samosas), Razzo Pizza in Leith is the best pizza in the city and for streetwear, go to Focus and Pieute." - Robin

"My favourite restaurant is Chez Jules - not iust because it's my nickname but because it's a neurodivergent's dream: candle liaht even at midday, simple but great French food, lots of corners to hide in. Please DON'T go there as it gets so busy I'm unlikely to find a seat." -Juliette Burton

"Keep a printed ticket in your hand if possible, this will act as flyering repellent. A strategy that has served me well for years." - Richard Wright

"Walking the beautiful cobbled streets of Edinburgh can be tiring - when I get tuckered out, the warm, dark performance spaces of my enemies can make the perfect place to nap." -Andy Barr

"I want to mention the museums or the Arthur's Seat or whatever. But ultimately, you haven't lived unless you've had a haggis pie and tattydog chaser from Piemaker on the South Bridge." -Steve McLean

"The Dagda Bar, 93-95 Buccleuch St. Feels like a snug, but has lots of chatter, and a great selection of whisky and session ales; I saw a pub quiz with two teams of geologists from the University get crazy nasty one night." - Mike McShane

"The Royal Botanic Garden. A peaceful escape with stunning gardens, less crowded than the city's other attractions, and a great place to relax and recharge during festival madness." - Sikisa

"Remember that, when it comes to venues on Cowgate, Google Maps only works on a certain level..." - Angela Bra

"Calton Hill is the Arthur's Seat for people who don't like hiking. It's amazing." - Thor Stenhaug

"Watch the military tattoo exit the castle on the Royal Mile after their evening performance. It is free!" - Jessie Deopp

"The Globe Bar is the cheapest place for a drink in centre of Edinburgh (it's also a comedy venue)." - Ian TC

"My best Ed Fringe hack is to take a packed lunch and flask of tea/coffee each day. Money saved on food is money spent on tickets to see more shows." - Yvonne Hughes

"Have a little sleep in the middle of the day." -James Campbell

"Till's bookshop is delightful. Second-hand books but a curated selection - a perfect escape from overstimulating shows." - Ben Pope

"Edinburgh can feel rather basic and/or touristy, especially during the festival. If you're looking for something with a more authentic, underground vibe, I can highly recommend having a drink at Paradise Palms!" - Carly Blair

"The REAL Edinburgh is a small tucked away alley called the Royal Mile. During August there is a paper festival where people all over the country hand out free origami kits as you walk by." - Josh

"For travellers, especially Australians looking to save money because the conversion rate is crazy. There is a place called £2 pizza on South Bridge. New York-style slices for only £2. Cheap, fast, and delicious. Good for running between shows or a quick meal before your show starts." - Matt Harvey

"Stand in any patch of sunlight you find for as long as possible." - Abby Wamburgh

"There is not legally a maximum number of times you can visit the free sample counter at the Royal Mile's House of Fudge. Do what you will with that information." - Lil Wenker

"Get a bag and write 'prop' on the side of it - you can just fill that up with cans and take it into the places where it's about £9 for a pint." - Jack

"One year I tried every falafel and hummus wrap within about 2 miles of the city centre, carefully making notes. The best one is Elfalafal, on Bristo Place, just over the road from Bristo Square as you walk down to the Grassmarket." - Marc Burrows

"I love going to the Warrender Swim Centre. They have a sauna next to the pool and a glass ceiling above the water. Best place to relax." - Jessica Aszkenasy

"Hula is great for getting some fresh fruit and vegetables in during the Fringe, and City Restaurant does amazing gluten-free fish and chips. " - Liz Guterbock

"The best tip is to create a really dramatic playlist for when you're walking around the city, so you can pretend to be, for example, Claudia Winkleman walking into the castle to announce a shock twist. It gives being a pedestrian some much-needed stakes." - Will Owen

"Buy a used bike for 10 guid, use it all festival, on the last day sell it to an American hipster for 40 quid." - Barnie Duncan

"My biggest hidden gem is Wings. It's not really a hidden gem but it's really good - they sell chicken wings and a hundred different sauces. It's really good and tasty." - Avo Adenekan

HardLove - When the Masks Slip, What's Left?

In HardLove, intimacy isn't romanticised, it's scrutinised. Directed by Jee Duman, this electric two-hander dares to ask what remains when two strangers are stripped of performance, left only with their stories, silence, and each other.

Originally written in Turkish and adapted into English, the play brings more than translation, it brings transformation. The translation across cultures deepens its themes of identity and displacement without demanding center stage. This is not a tale of assimilation or struggle, but of presence and what it means to exist, to connect and to be fully seen.

Duman steers the narrative with sharp attention to the tension between fantasy and truth. The characters — raw, awkward, funny, aching, even teeter on the edge of revelation and retreat, caught in the messy choreography of trying to reach someone who might never meet you halfway.

HardLove confronts themes of femininity, masculinity, depression, sex-positivity, and the performativity of both theatre and self. However, it never announces these topics. Instead, it lives them, in glances, in gestures, in the uncomfortable space between lines.



Urgent, disarming, and unexpectedly funny, HardLove isn't a relationship drama. It's something more dangerous, a mirror. As the characters wrestle with their own masks, audiences are quietly invited to examine their own.

Josh Bergasse Brings World's Greatest Lover to Life at the Edinburgh Fringe

When Emmy Award-winning choreographer and director Josh Bergasse was approached with the idea for World's Greatest Lover, there was no script, just a wild, theatrical concept about five of history's most iconic lovers vying for the ultimate romantic title. Intrigued by its comedic potential and collaborative spirit, Bergasse dove in, helping shape a bold, fast-paced musical that now makes its UK debut at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe.

With original music, cheeky choreography, and a healthy dose of irreverent fun, World's Greatest Lover premiered in New York before evolving through audience feedback into the tight, crowd-pleasing spectacle it is today. "It's comedy first," Bergasse explains, "but each character reveals something about how we view love, there's substance beneath the silliness."


Each lover, from Romeo to other legendary lotharios, gets their own musical moment, all underpinned by Bergasse's signature style: high energy, narrative-rich movement, and an inclusive spirit that welcomes the audience into the action.




Despite his extensive experience on Broadway and television, this marks Bergasse's first time at the Edinburgh Fringe. "It's been on my bucket list," he admits. "There's nothing else like it. To bring a new, joyful piece here, it feels right."

With heart, humor, and a touch of theatrical chaos, World's Greatest Lover is primed to charm Fringe audiences this August. Under Bergasse's dynamic direction, the show doesn't just spoof the world of romance. it celebrates it.
